Green Lane Improvements

You may have noticed the work carried out on Green Lane last Autumn, including removing trip hazards, cutting back vegetation, and scraping back soil to reveal the original surface. This work was carried out by Norfolk County Council as a direct result of pressure from CAWRA. There are still issues with the surface, and puddles continue to form after heavy rain. We will keep up the pressure on the council to make further improvements to this route.
